

# ✂ CHRISTMAS ADVENT CALENDAR

## MATERIALS NEEDED:

Gingerpaper House Kit · Eco-White 1 1/4" Circle Label Sheets · Pool 1/8" Satin Ribbon · Red A7 Box Mailer (Optional) · Red 4" Round Label Sheet (Optional) · 1/4" Super Tape · Glue Stick · Scissors

## INSTRUCTIONS:

When assembling the roof and shingles of the gingerpaper house kit, do not apply adhesive to the entire area of the shingles. Assemble shingles onto roof panels by applying only a line of glue stick along the top edge of shingles (A). Attach only one side of a shingled roof to the house's front and back triangles (B). This will create a hinged roof lid for placing treats inside. Assemble the rest of the gingerpaper house kit as instructed.

Download pdf of countdown numbers 1-25 available on our website or print your own or write onto labels using your favorite pen. If printing your own, via microsoft word template on our ps site, follow these steps. Go to format, go to font, select desired font, input font size (approximately 20), go to character spacing, position: lowered, by: (approximately 50-65 pt), click ok and print. These steps will allow you to print numbers on the lower half of each sticker.

Fold stickers almost in half (C). Stick in place, using exposed portion of sticker, onto shingles by tucking slightly under rows.

Finish with a ribbon handle, measuring approximately 7", by looping and adhering into place under middle of shingled roof line with a 1 1/4" circle label.

Tips: For a multi-kid family, add a bowl of treats for everyone to enjoy in the countdown or add one special treat each day. Use extra round stickers to cover numbers counting down to christmas, peel off printed numbers or keep a marker handy to cross off each day!

Optional: For added support to the house foundation and to create a container for treats, fit the gingerpaper house frame on top of an A7 box mailer lid. For a clean finish, at doorway, fold a Red 4" round label in half and adhere half to top and wrap other half under. Secure house in place with doublestick tape on corners of mailer lid.
